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FOREWORD BY THE NATIONAL COMMISSIONER OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN POLICE SERVICE

I would like to dedicate the 2005/2006 Annual Report of the South African Police Service to the 156 000 police employees who have dedicated their lives to community service and especially to those among them who sacrificed their own lives protecting others and our democracy.

This Annual Report is a document which has been thoroughly researched and prepared so that the South African Police Service can produce a comprehensive account, to Parliament and to the community, of our activities during the last financial year. Included in this document is a complete set of national crime statistics for the period 1 April 2005 to 31 March 2006.

Our proud record of ensuring that elections are conducted in a free and fair environment has been sustained and management of the SAPS would like to thank all members who performed their duties with dignity and respect for this democratic procedure.

The South African Police Service has commenced with a restructuring process aimed at empowering



and equipping our police stations to function expertly and with authority in rendering professional policing services to their local communities. The process will see the migration to police stations of trained members from various specialised units, as well as experienced members from Head Office, the nine provincial offices and - particularly - the 43 area offices throughout the country. This will take place in a sensitive manner, as we are dealing with human beings with families and homes, and with as little disruption to the individual member as possible. I am convinced that this move will result in a more streamlined and effective police service and I am counting on the support of all members to ensure that we achieve our intended results as quickly and smoothly as possible.

Over the next four years we all have to roll up our sleeves and commit ourselves to ensuring that the Soccer World Cup 2010 is the most magnificent sporting event the world has experienced. The South African Police Service's plans are already firmly in place and we look forward to cementing our reputation as world leaders in securing major events.

My management team and I remain committed to improving the service conditions of our members, to protecting the lives of our people, to securing their communities in conjunction with other Government departments and role players and to working towards a better life for all.

INFORMATION ON THE MINISTRY FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY

In accordance with section 206(1) of the Constitution, 1996 (Act No 108 of 1996), the Minister for Safety and Security is responsible for policing in general, and is required to give account to Cabinet and Parliament on all matters relating to policing. An important feature of the Minister's responsibility is the determination of national policing policy and the provision of civilian oversight.

Institutions that report to the Minister for Safety and Security:

- **The South African Police Service**

Purpose: To create a safe and secure environment for all people in South Africa.

- **The Secretariat for Safety and Security**

Purpose: To provide support to the Minister in the execution of his duties.

- **The Independent Complaints Directorate**

Purpose: An independent police complaints body that investigates alleged misconduct of, or alleged offences committed by a member(s) of the SA Police Service.



- **Democratic Republic of the Congo**

Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of the RSA and the Government of the Democratic Republic of Congo relating to cooperation on capacity building for the Congolese National Police.

- **Republic of Uganda**

Agreement between the Government of the RSA and the Government of the Republic of Uganda on Police Cooperation.

- **United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland**

Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Island through the Department of International Development and the Government of the RSA acting through the South African Police Service regarding the provision and installation of police communication equipment by South Africa for election security in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

LEGISLATION

No new legislation has been introduced during the above reporting period by the Minister for Safety and Security. The protection of Constitutional Democracy against Terrorist and Related Activities Act, 2004 (Act No 33 of 2004), was fully implemented on 20 May 2005.

AGREEMENTS

The Republic of South Africa during the reporting period concluded international agreements with the following countries/entities:

THE VISION OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN POLICE SERVICE IS TO -

- create a safe and secure environment for all people in South Africa.

THE MISSION OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN POLICE SERVICE –

- prevent anything that may threaten the safety or security of any community;
- investigate any crimes that threaten the safety and security of any community;
- ensure criminals are brought to justice; and
- participate in efforts to address the root causes of crime.

THE VALUES OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN POLICE SERVICE ARE TO –

- protect everyone's rights and to be impartial, respectful, open and accountable to the community;
- use the powers given to us in responsible way;
- provide a responsible, effective and high-quality service with honesty and integrity;
- evaluate our service continuously and make every effort to improve on it;
- use our resources in the best way possible;
- develop the skills of all members through equal opportunity; and
- cooperate with the community, all levels of Government and other role-players.

CORE OBJECTIVES BASED ON CONSTITUTIONAL AND OTHER LEGISLATIVE AND FUNCTIONAL MANDATES

The Constitutional mandate of the Department for Safety and Security and the South African Police Service (SAPS) is reflected in Section 205 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 (Act No 108 of 1996). The Objects of Policing as per Section 205 are to –

- prevent, combat and investigate crime;
- maintain public order;
- protect and secure the inhabitants of the Republic and their property; and
- to uphold and enforce the law.



The fundamental role that the Department is required to fulfil is clearly defined by the Objects of Policing. These Objects of Policing constitute the Core Objectives of the Department, and inform the strategic and operational activities of the organisation.

The mandate of the Department and the SAPS is also defined by a number of other South African statutes, all of which are subordinate to the Constitution, but which collectively determine the authority of the SAPS. The following key statutes constitute the primary legislative mandate of the SAPS:

- cooperate with all interested parties in the community and the government at every level.

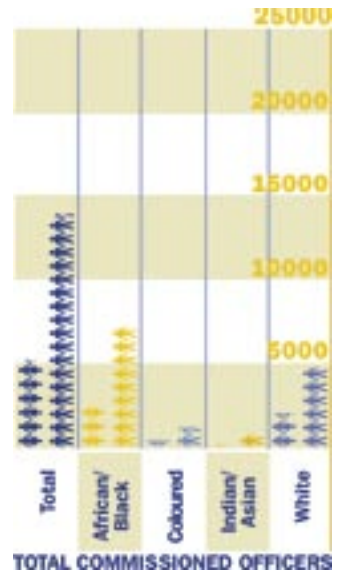
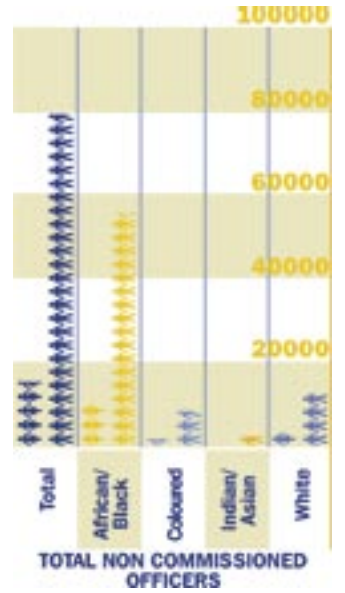
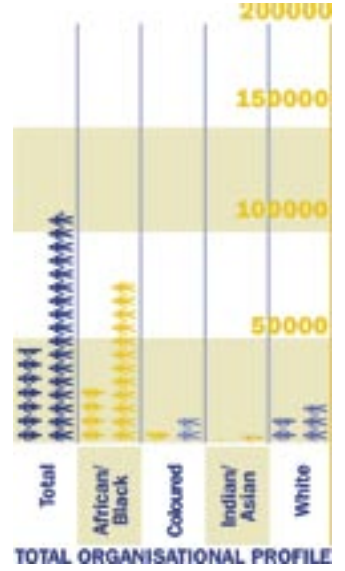
In order to achieve a safe and secure environment for all the people of South Africa I undertake to –
